
Children with disability are more at risk of abuse than other children.

Do you know what you would do in a situation where your child disclosed information about abuse or they told you one of the other children had really rude photos'?


Often parents don't want to think about dealing with a situation like this because it's scary and they hope it won't ever happen to their child.
